Is the research original, significant, and clearly written?
Does the abstract clearly summarize the aims methods, findings, and conclusions?
Is the research problem clearly defined and well-contextualized?
Are the key literature and the study's contributions clearly presented?
Are the methods sufficiently detailed for replication and properly cited?
Are new approaches justified, and is the statistical analysis appropriate?
Are the data clearly presented and logically interpreted?
Are limitations acknowledged, and are the contributions meaningful?
Are the conclusions supported by the results without overstatement?
Are references, figures, and tables accurate and clearly presented?
